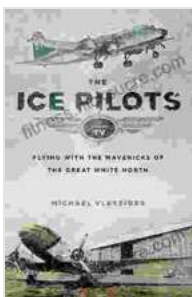

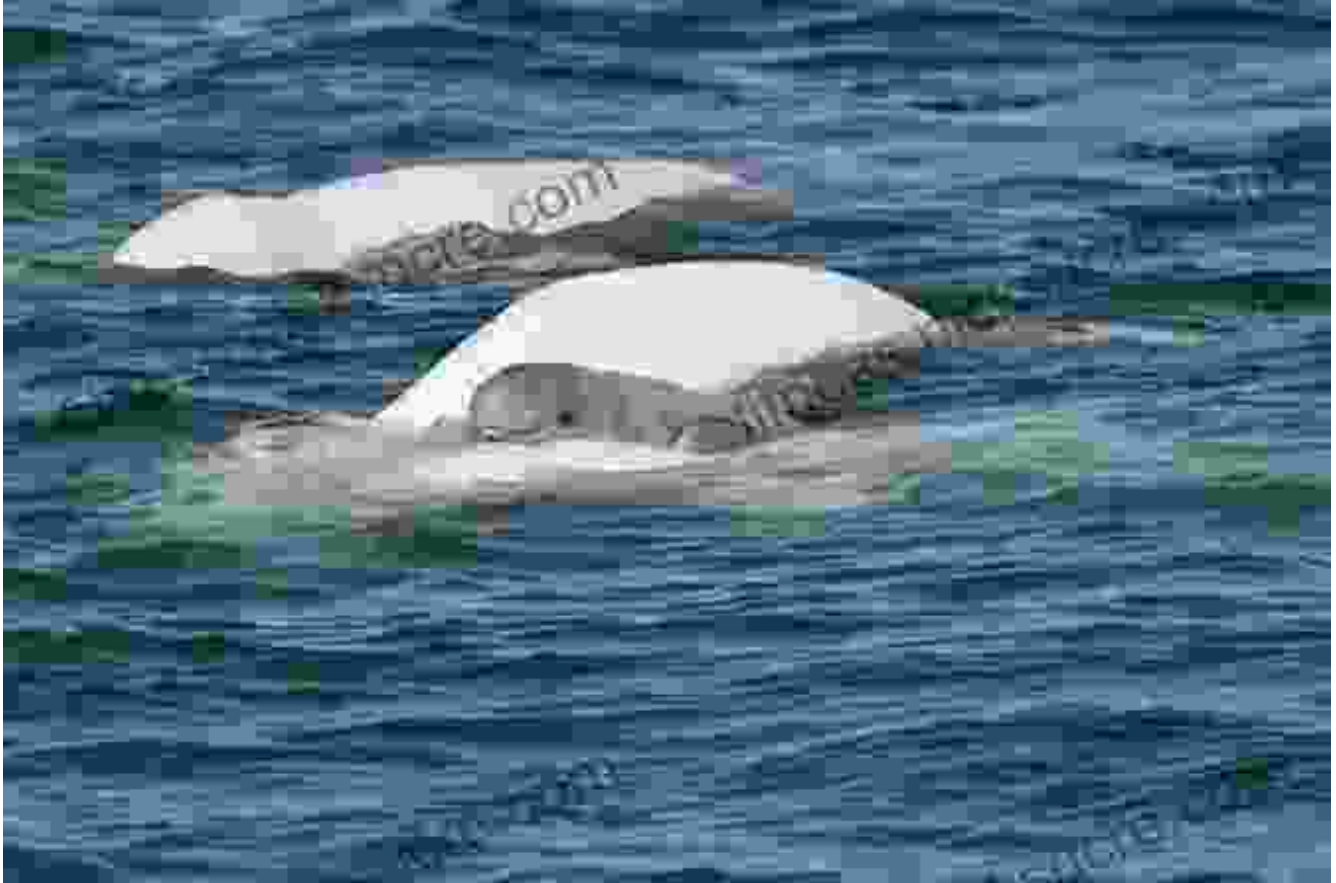
3. Tadoussac, Quebec

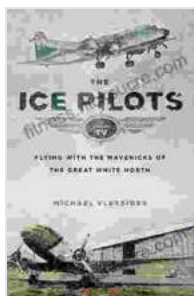


6. Johnstone Strait, British Columbia
