


## 2. Paper Airplane Blaster

## 6. Ping Pong Ball Blaster

This blaster is a lot of fun, and it's perfect for practicing your aim. You'll need a ping pong ball, a straw, and a piece of duct tape. Tape the ping pong ball to the end of the straw. Blow into the straw and watch the ping pong ball fly!


