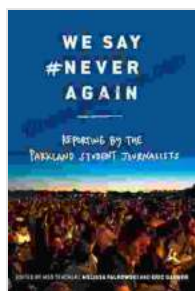


Reporting By The Parkland Student Journalists

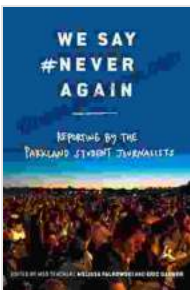
