
Clove Hitch Knot


Halter Tie Knot

Sheet Bend Knot


The sheet bend knot is a strong and secure knot that is used to tie two ropes together. It is also a good knot for tying a rope to a ring or a hook.

To tie a sheet bend knot, follow these steps:

1. Make a small loop in the end of one rope.
2. Pass the end of the other rope through the loop from behind.

3. Bring the end of the other rope back through the loop from the front.
4. Pass the end of the other rope over the standing part of the first rope.
5. Pass the end of the other rope under the standing part of the first rope.
6. Pass the end of the other rope through the loop again from behind.
7. Pull the ends of both ropes tight to form a knot.




Stopper Knot

3. Bring the end of the rope back through the loop from the front.


